

Playing the Nebraska Lottery does more than just give you the chance to put giant checks in your pocket. In fact, the money you spend on the various Scratch tickets and Lotto games funds different charitable organizations. One such fund is the Nebraska Opportunity Grant (NOG).

The Opportunity Grant is money that is set aside by Nebraska's Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education (CCPE) for helping students in need. The money is distributed to colleges and universities throughout the state, who then give it to chosen applicants to use for college educational expensed such as tuition, housing, and textbooks.

To qualify, students need to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which will determine if they have the minimum expected family contribution. Students also need to be attending a college or university in Nebraska and be a Nebraska resident.

One NOG recipient is Ruth Godejohn, a student from Shelby who is attending Central Community College to study hospital administration.

"It helped when we were scraping the bottom of our pockets to find the money for gas and food," Godejohn said. "It seemed to have arrived at the perfect moment-especially when you have a whole other week till payday."

Godejohn is planning on transferring to the University of Nebraska–Omaha to continue to work towards her bachelor's degree. After earning her degree, she is hoping to pursue work at the Children's Hospital or Methodist Hospitals.

Another recipient from Central Community College is Joseph Blattner. Blattner is studying to become a hospital lab technician but is going for a very different reason than Godejohn.

"I had amputated my hand at work when I was 42," Blattner said. "I needed a career change and I figured that the medical field is always going to be there."

Blattner is a full-time student who also works part-time. He says that the money he received from the grant helped him keep up with his bills and buy some textbooks and a computer for school.

Xenon Academy in Omaha also helps students through the NOG. Kirsten Schutz attends the cosmetology school because of her passion for makeup and skincare. She found out about the grant from the business administrator at Xenon and was excited when she received it.

"I am so grateful for this grant," Schutz said. "Thanks to it I have minimal debt and I get to do what I love."

The Nebraska Opportunity Grant helped just under 13,000 students pay for their post secondary education last year. Funding for the grant comes from a combination of Nebraska Lottery proceeds and money from the state.

Grand Island Couple Wins \$1 Million Playing Powerball



Peter and Tammy Van Winkle of Grand Island won \$1 million playing Powerball from the Nebraska Lottery.

Van Winkle purchased his winning ticket at Fast Mart at 6835 North 27th Street in Lincoln. The ticket contained a single quick pick play that matched five out of five winning numbers (05, 21, 36, 61, 62) but not the winning Powerball number (18) from the July 25 drawing.

The Van Winkles were on their way back to Grand Island from a shopping trip in Omaha when they pulled off the highway to fill up with gas. Tammy went inside Fast Mart to buy a couple of Lotto tickets and a Scratch ticket for the ride home.

The tickets sat in a pile for a few days until Peter decided to check them. He checked a Lucky for Life ticket that won \$3, then he checked his Powerball ticket. The Check-A-Ticket machine said "Winner, present original ticket to Nebraska Lottery". He didn't take it to the front counter, to see what he'd won. Instead he decided to take the ticket home.

"I got this weird feeling I should sign the back," he said. "My heart rate immediately increased."

He went home and checked the numbers on the Nebraska Lottery website with Tammy. Then they checked again. And again. They said they probably checked 20 times to make sure they were reading it correctly.

The Van Winkles said they're probably going to use the money on trading in their car and paying off a loan. Tammy said they've got a kid who's about three years away from college, so the money will help with that as well.

Tammy runs A Higher Plane, a crystal store in Grand Island, and said that she'd been using the law of attraction to visualize her family winning at Powerball. Peter said he has another way of looking at it.

"I just buy them," he said. "It's cheaper than a beer."

The odds of winning \$1 million playing Powerball are 1 in 11,688,053.52 while the overall odds of winning any prize are 1 in 24.9.
